Have you visited the Adelaide Zoo to see Wang Wang and Funi? These two gorgeous Giant Pandas that moved to Australia from China in late 2009, are not only one of the most loved animals here but are also treasured around the world.

Giant pandas are considered one of the animals vulnerable to extinction. They are also considered a Chinese national treasure because they are native to China.

The panda is known for its distinct black and white colouring. The eyes, ears, arms, legs, and shoulders are all black, while the rest of the body is white.

In this worksheet we will learn how to say the most common body parts in Chinese. The Giant Panda diagram below will help you learn them!
