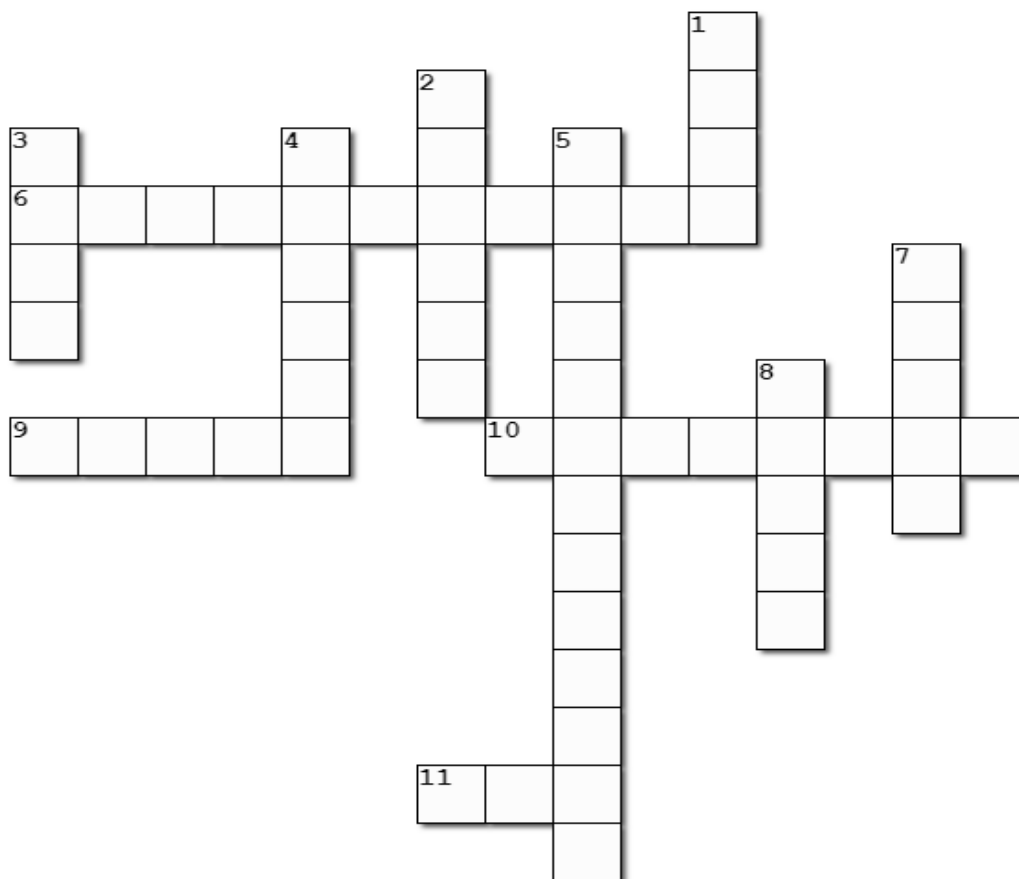


Terracotta Army 兵马俑
