Spring 春天 is seen as the first season of the year and Winter 冬天 is seen as the last season of the year.

China—March, April and May



Summer 夏天 xià tiān

Australia—December, January and February
China—June, July and August

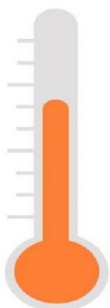


Autumn 秋天 qiū tiān

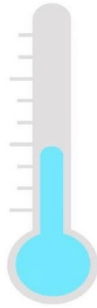
Australia—March, April and May

Winter 冬天 dōng tiān

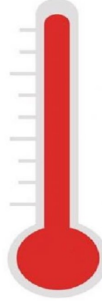

China—December, January and February



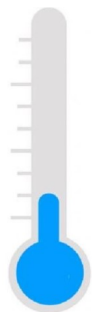

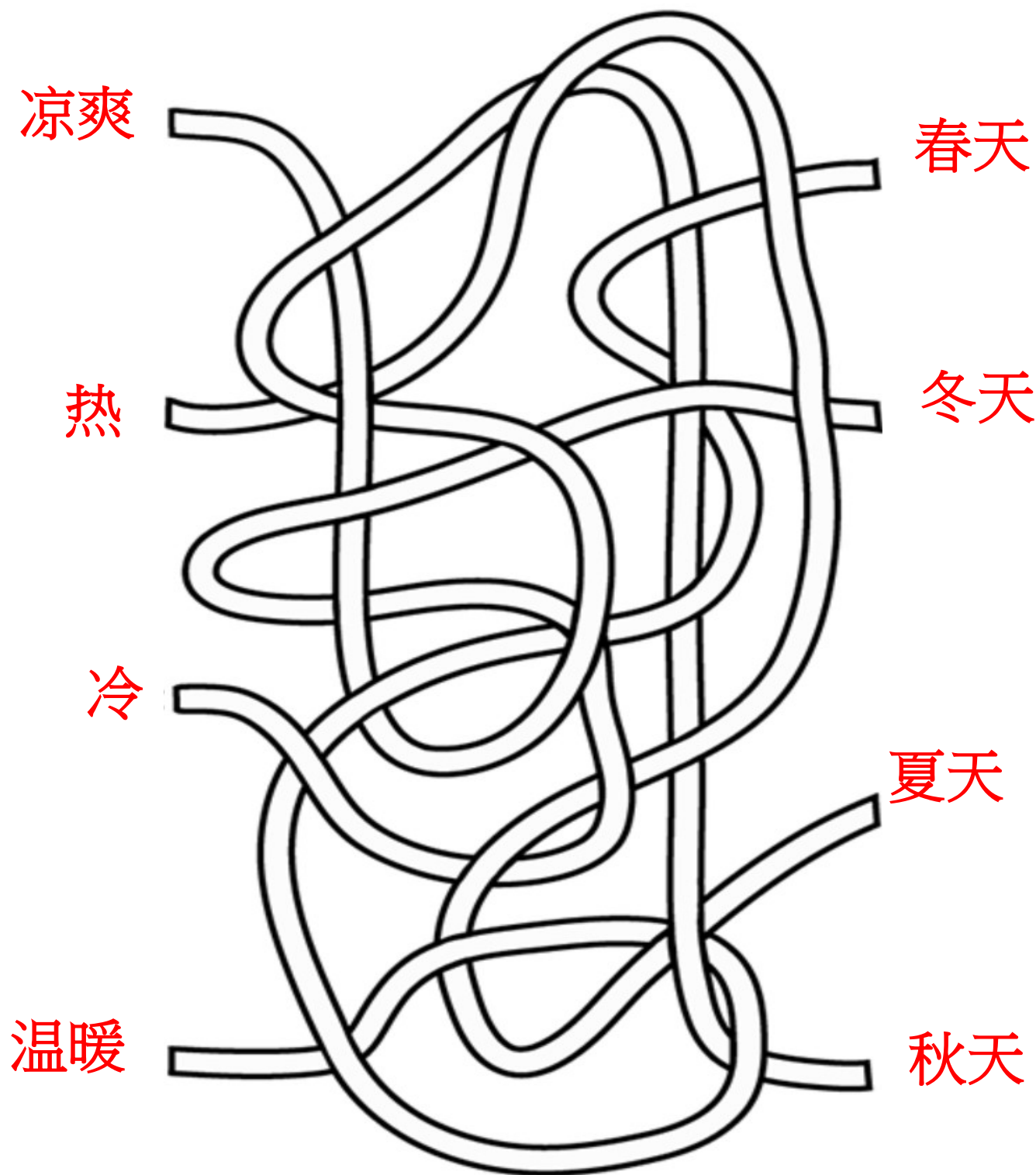
